

Timber Shutters

Operating Instructions

Front Tilt Bar

For shutters with a front tilt bar, use the tilt bar to adjust the louvre closure. Its best to do this by clasping the tilt rod in the centre and moving blades up or down.

Clearview Hidden Tilt Bar

For shutters with Clearview hidden tilt mechanism, for the best result gently grasp a louvre blade in the middle of the panel and move the louvre to the closed position.

For best closing results, run your hand over the louvres to close them completely.

Opening Hinged, Bi-Fold on Track & Sliding Shutters

To open out a hinged or hinged bi-fold shutter grasp the side stile (frame) and swing open. *(Do not use the blade or control rod).*

When shutters are stacked back ensure the blades are closed or they will clash with wall architecture or opposing panel.

For sliding panels, simply move panels sideways (blades will normally need to be closed to stack bracket). When shutters are across opening, blades then can be opened.

Do not grab the tilt bar or louvre to open out a hinged or bi-fold on track shutter or to slide a sliding shutter as this will place too much pressure on the tilt bar and louvre and could cause breakage.
